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Access to institutions and interviewees: How difficult it will be to gain access to interviewees and data? Consider a pilot study. Will the want to be recorded? Are there any risks for me? Costs and time: III. What are the travel and accommodation costs (for an extended period)? Can I afford this? How much time do I need stay in the field and how early before that do I need to plan the interviews? Language capabilities: IV. Do I master the local language? Am I capable of understanding documents? Doing an interview?
